**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2024
FOOTPATH 18 WOODHAM MORTIMER**

On 19 March 2024 Essex County Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert a part length of Footpath 18 Woodham Mortimer of unknown width shown by a bold continuous line on the order map commencing from a field edge boundary west of Kestrel's Cottage running as a cross-field path in a north westerly direction through a vineyard for a total distance of approximately 162 metres where it continues unaffected to a footpath being 2 metres in width shown by a bold broken line on the order map from the aforementioned field edge boundary in a south westerly direction along a field boundary for a distance of approximately 140 metres then continuing along the field boundary in a northerly direction for a final distance of approximately 87 metres where it continues unaffected.

Documents can be made available for inspection 8.30am-4.30pm Mon-Fri at Essex County Council, County Hall, E block main reception, Market Road, Chelmsford if so required following the current social distancing restrictions. The alternative route comes into force on 16 April 2024 and the old route shall be stopped up with effect from 23 April 2024, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 4 April 2024 make an application to the High Court.
